

BIG FLAT COMMUNITY GRAIN BIN PLANS FUNDRAISER EVENT

TURNER, MT—Spring is just around the corner, and creatures are stirring all over the Big Flat. It's time for a varmint hunt, and the Big Flat Community Grain Bin foundation is planning an event for all ages to help raise the fees needed to file for 501(c)(3) tax-exempt status with the IRS.

The Varmint Hunt begins at 6pm, Friday, Feb. 25th and runs until 6pm, Saturday, Feb. 26th. Entry forms are available from PJ or Tricia Kimmel at 379-2512 or enter in person at Kimber's Border Bar & Grill before the start of the hunt. Entry fees are \$30 per 3 person team. Minors must have completed Hunter Safety and have parental permission.

Earn points to win. Different kinds of "varmints" earn different points. Cash prizes will be awarded to the first, second and third place teams. The points awarded for each animal are as follows:

- 50 points – Badger
- 25 points – Coyote
- 20 points – Fox
- 15 points – Porcupine, Skunk or Raccoon
- 10 points – Rabbit
- 5 points – Gopher

Following the hunt, prizes will be awarded and a free-will donation meal will be provided by the BFCGB at Kimber's Border Bar. The meal is open to anyone, hunters or non-hunters, who wish to attend.
